Revamping our community giving efforts Supporting retiree volunteerism

After her mother lost her battle with cancer. Margi Carducci, with the help of her co-workers at DCPP, raised nearly \$90,000 over 12 years for the American Cancer Society's annual Relay for Life walkathon. Of this amount. \$8,000 was contributed through PG&E's Community Service Award (CSA) program and PG&E's online grants.

This year we're excited to announce improvements to the CSA program that make it easier for employees and retirees to get involved and get funding for important organizations. PG&E's CSA program provides individual and team grants to gualifying nonprofits on behalf of employees and retirees who volunteer at least 40 hours of personal time per year.

"It's really neat to see that the company wants to be involved," said Carducci. "They see it as more than just an obligation. I think their heart is really in it; they care."

Whether it is helping to honor a loved one's memory through a national fundraising event or donating to a local hospital, the CSA links employees and retirees to causes they care about.

David Lopez, who retired in 2006 after 37 years as a PG&E gas service representative, has donated through CSA to John Muir Medical Center in Walnut Creek, where he works as a volunteer.

Lopez said PG&E's donation of \$250 a year is typically used toward hospital equipment or other necessities. "They really appreciate the check from PG&E," he said. "I'm very proud that I worked for PG&E and that I can give back to my community."

Enhanced Community Service Award Program

The CSA program has been enhanced with new criteria to help broaden the categories for grants to be donated on your behalf to 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations:

- Team CSA (\$500): Coordinate a group of 10 or more employees or retirees for a volunteer activity.
- Team CSA (\$250): Coordinate a group of five or more employees or retirees for a volunteer activity.
- Individual CSA (\$250): Volunteer at least 40 hours of personal time (employees or retirees) during the year.

We have removed the criteria that team projects must be environmentally focused events. All volunteer team projects in partnership with a nonprofit or school will qualify.

Applicants can be part-time, full-time or retired PG&E employees, or the spouse of a retired PG&E employee.
