Smart-Pig technology allows PG&E to assess, validate its gas pipelines

MILPITAS—A 14-foot-long "smart pig" weighing nearly a ton is helping PG&E inspect the insides of its large natural gas pipelines.

The state-of-the-art inspection tool, commonly known as a smart pig, was on display for the media on July 9 at PG&E's Milpitas Gas Terminal at the intersection of Interstate 880 and Highway 237.

Jesus Soto Jr., PG&E's senior vice president of gas transmission operations, was joined by representatives of PII Pipeline Solutions and the fire chief of Milpitas in speaking about the technology and how it benefits PG&E customers throughout the company's service area.

Using a medical analogy, Soto said that the tool "provides an MRI for a pipeline segment and will help us increase the effectiveness of how we assess our pipeline segments." Soto joined PG&E recently after a 20-year career with El Paso Corporation's Pipeline Group. "I can tell you that this is the most advanced way to determine the overall condition of the pipeline," he said.

PII Pipeline Solutions' Eric Quick explained how the tool collects data about the pipeline. Quick is the global products marketing leader for the pig's manufacturer, which is a joint venture of GE Oil & Gas and Al Shaheen. Smart pigs rely on GPS mapping data, magnetic sensors and other technology to record detailed information from inside the pipeline. They can find defects as well as measure the thickness of pipeline walls. And, if corrosion or any other signs of weakness are found, repair crews are able to reach the part of the pipeline that needs work with precision.

Smart pigs are free-swimming, Quick added, meaning that the pressure of the gas moves them through the pipeline, ideally at 5 or 10 mph.

The massive tool can be used to test pipelines measuring 24- to 30-inches in diameter. The multi-diameter flexibility makes it especially useful, Quick said. He demonstrated how the technology works using a 5-foot-long model that can inspect 6-inch-diameter pipelines.

The larger smart pig will be used later this week to assess a pipeline that runs from Fremont to San Lorenzo.

The backdrop for Monday's event was the PG&E's Milpitas Terminal, where gas transmission pipelines that feed Santa Clara, San Mateo and San Francisco counties begin.

Chief Brian Sturdivant of the Milpitas Fire Department spoke of the "robust" relationship that his agency has with PG&E. Over the past 18 months, a series of meetings has led to refining emergency-response procedures and practicing drills that included first-responders and PG&E.

During 2012, PG&E plans eight smart-pig inspections covering more than 200 miles of pipelines; more are planned for 2013 and 2014. Additionally in 2012, PG&E plans to replace about 39 miles of transmission pipeline; conduct hydrostatic strength tests on about 170 miles of pipeline; and install 46 automated valves.

That progress is significant, Soto said, "but when it comes to safety, our job is never done."
