Putting Safety at the Center of Everything We Do

Learn more about PG&E's 2014 General Rate Case

PG&E's ability to generate revenue for our ongoing operations and critical infrastructure investments is decided every three years by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) in a general rate case (GRC). The CPUC is conducting a thorough, yearlong review of our 2014 GRC. That decision will set the amount of money that PG&E can collect from rates for gas and electric distribution and electric generation for the years 2014-2016.

What's different about this GRC?

More than ever before, the focus is on making smart investments that will put the safety of the public, our customers, employees and retirees at the center of everything we do. Our commitment to excellent service has to start with safe and reliable operations.

Another important difference this year will be the involvement of third-party experts, hired by the CPUC to evaluate technical aspects of PG&E's proposal with a special focus on safety. The yearlong review will also include public participation hearings; independent reviews from the CPUC's Division of Ratepayer Advocates and various other groups representing consumers, environmental interests, small and medium businesses and others; and formal hearings conducted by an administrative law judge at the CPUC.

How much are we asking for?

Our rate case calls for an additional \$1.28 billion over currently authorized spending levels in 2014. It also asks for additional increases of about \$500 million in 2015 and 2016 to account for additional infrastructure improvements and increased costs of labor, materials, supplies and other expenses.

How will this impact our customers?

Customers will see a modest increase in their energy bills. If approved, electric bills for the typical residential customer would increase less than \$5 per month in 2014, to about \$94 per month. For natural gas customers, the typical residential bill would increase about \$7 per month, to just over \$53 per month. Even with these increases, PG&E's typical residential electric and gas bills would remain well below national averages.

Business customers will see a significant improvement in PG&E's outreach and assistance. We plan to hire nearly 150 more employees to help business and agricultural customers with issues that they may be facing, including understanding and taking best advantage of new energy tools and rate options.

Our GRC will create jobs and help our local communities

Spending authorized by the GRC will support thousands of new jobs and increased funding for local services and will help our state economy. Approval of this rate case will support approximately 39,000 jobs—a total of nearly \$3 billion in wages each year—and generate an estimated \$685 million per year in state and local tax revenue.

Next Steps

The CPUC is conducting a thorough, yearlong review of PG&E's operations and costs, including public participation hearings, comments from ratepayer advocates and interested parties, and evidentiary hearings before an administrative law judge. At the end of this process, the CPUC will issue a decision, currently expected by the end of 2013.
