PG&E to Offer Targeted Electric Rate Reductions to Promote Economic Development

PG&E will soon begin offering a competitive new electric rate aimed at promoting economic development by making it possible for eligible employers to keep, expand or launch new operations in California rather than leave the state. The new rate, approved by the California Public Utilities Commission, is designed to benefit all PG&E customers by making more revenues available to cover fixed costs.

"As a major supplier to California businesses, PG&E is committed to helping create and retain jobs in our communities by offering appropriate incentives that will enhance our state's competitiveness and energize its economy," said **Chris Johns**, PG&E's president. "Our new economic development rate goes hand in hand with other initiatives we have launched to boost economic vitality in the communities we serve."

The newly approved economic development rate targets companies—with power loads of at least 200 kilowatts—that would otherwise locate operations and hire employees out of state. The rate will provide a 12 percent rate reduction for five years for those companies needing to site new operations, expand existing facilities, or to cut costs in order to stay in California.

The utility will offer a rate reduction of 30 percent for five years to cities and counties in PG&E's service area with unemployment rates at least 25 percent higher than the state average.

PG&E's proposal to support job creation, which was drafted in consultation with several local government leaders, received unprecedented support from a coalition of 31 cities and 10 counties in northern and central California.
